


# **Planting with Purpose: Growing a Better Community**

On April 17, 2021 Kiwanis of Southport and Oak Island hosted its 19th annual plant sale at the St. James Community Center. The sale featured twice-a-year blooming encore azaleas in addition to landscape bushes, flowers and herbs. All proceeds from the sale will benefit the children of Brunswick County.

The plant sale had humble beginnings. In 2002, Tom Pezanowski of Southport received a call from a Kiwanis member asking for

help to organize a plant sale fundraiser. Pezanowksi was perfect for the job - a North Carolina State Extension Master Gardener of Brunswick County with a heart for volunteerism. He had volunteered with Boy Scouts, participated in town clean up events and worked with troubled teens. Pezanowski immediately took charge of the plant sale, contacted a nursery in Alabama, informed the community about the sale and took pre-orders. And then he displayed 280 encore azaleas in his own driveway in St. James Plantation. The result was a surprising \$2242 in proceeds.

The sale has come a long


way since then. It now includes Southport, Oak Island and a presence at the Southport Spring Festival as well as the addition of shrubs, herbs and flowers. Since 2002, the plant sale has generated \$95,283 in proceeds.

Larry Trainor of Southport became involved in the plant sale in 2016 and took over responsibility from Pezanowski in 2018 after training with him for two years.

"I took over to give Tom a break. Even though he's older than me, he has more energy than me," Trainor says laughing.

"In addition to the plant sale, my regular volunteer Kiwanis activities are Meals on Wheels, Royal Readers, Listening Post and Peer Court," further explains Trainor. "I'm retired and have time to give back. I didn't volunteer that much while working. It's so much fun working with the

kids and Brunswick County children have so many needs. Kiwanis is the perfect way to help kids."

The volunteer work of the members of Kiwanis has broad reach. Chartered in 1993, the

85 men and women volunteers of Kiwanis of Southport and Oak Island serve the communities of Southport, Oak Island, Boiling Spring Lakes, St. James, Bolivia, and Supply through service, education, guidance, and leadership. The scope of outreach is extensive: Teen Court and Peer Court, Terrific Kids, Royal Readers, Listening Post, First Tee, New Hope Clinic, Matthews' Ministry, Interfaith Food Pantry, Comput-



ers for Kids, Boys and Girls Homes of North Carolina, Brunswick Family Assistance and Meals on Wheels. Kiwanis also supplies books to the Kiwanis Lending Library located on Howe Street in Southport, provides fresh produce to local underserved families from its volunteer-cultivated Giving Garden in Bolivia, and offers \$20,000 annually in scholarships.

The chapter was proud to be recognized as a Powerful Partner in 2017 by Brunswick County Schools. In 2020 the group received the American Legion of North Carolina Children and Youth

Services award, and for the 19<sup>th</sup> consecutive year, the Kiwanis International Distinguished Club award. Volunteer hours average 10,000 annually.



Trainor is quick to point out that the plant sale would not be successful without the support of the four nurseries, Flowerwood Nursery, Tinga Nursery, Carolina Greenery and Shelton Herb Farm, who sell to Kiwanis at wholesale. The plant sale is open for customers from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. in the rear parking lot of the St. James Community Center at 4136 Southport-Supply Road SE.

Trainor says, "During these difficult times, the need is greater than ever. Come out and support us. The money we raise goes directly to the children we serve. 100%. And you can get our plants for the same price or less than at local nurseries. Plus, you don't have to travel far at all. It's a win-win for everyone!"

# Update and Final on the 5K Run

The Brunswick Wellness Coalition's (BWC) Virtual 5K/1m Spring Into Health Run was a huge success thanks to the 5k committee, sponsors, swag donors, and registrants! There were 406 registrants, ages 3-82, some of whom were registered for last year's canceled run. Outcomes included male and female 5K fastest runners

were in the 50+ age group, the Brunswick Senior Resources Inc.-Leland center team is start-

ing a walking group and one youth is beginning track at his school! There were many inspiration stories. One of these came about from the Brunswick Senior Resources Inc.-Shallotte center team. A co-worker who had been hospitalized in the ICU from COVID-19 and who had returned to work with oxygen wanted to participate in the run so they rallied around her walking with her to demonstrate their support!



As in previous years, Cape Fear Fitness and Tropical Smoothie sponsored the run. Ongoing relationships like these have allowed Spring Into Health to continue since its' inception in 2018. With many races being canceled, partnering with the Southport Oak Island Kiwanis Club was a good fit as they are one of BWC's partners and has received support of the Kiwanis Giving Garden at Horseplay Farms. Through donations and profits, BWC will re-invest funds to support the Club's health initiatives and scholarships.

Comprised of a united group of individuals who are health-minded with the mission to improve the health of the Brunswick community, and the vision of becoming the healthiest county in North Carolina, BWC is one of 10 coalitions in North Carolina made possible by Healthy People, Healthy Carolinas, an initiative of The Duke Endow-men



Team Kiwanis ended up with 50 individuals registering for the Spring Into Health 5K or1 mile run/walk event, which was a good level of participation from the club. That number included Kiwanians and family and friends of Kiwanians. We had asked people to donate at least \$10 when they signed up because our focus was on fund raising, and as a result, we raised almost \$800 in donations. We had two

friends of Kiwanis who wanted to show their support for the club by each donating \$100. While we have

not yet gotten a final number from the Brunswick Wellness Coalition for the total amount our club will receive in addition to the donations, the event will for sure end up being a successful fund raiser. Hopefully next year we will be able to have an in person event but also have the option of a "virtual" run or walk for folks who prefer to do their distance on their own or with their own small group.
