Kiwanis Speaker Series May 10, 2022

On the evening of May 10, 2022, Southport history came to life during the third presentation of the Southport-Oak Island Kiwanis Club Speaker Series. Liz Fuller, PhD and Vice President of the Southport Historical Society, was the guest speaker. Dr. Fuller wowed the crowded St. James Community Center audience with her talk entitled, "Like Mother, Like Daughter - 230 Years of Southport's History". Reflecting on Mother's Day, which was two days prior to her presentation, Dr. Fuller walked the crowd through the everyday lives of several women, connecting their past to the

context of larger historical events that were significant to Southport's development. Originally named Smithville, the town was centered around Fort Johnston, built at the mouth of the Cape Fear River, and grew as a fishing village and military town. It was popular as a summer resort because of its pleasant climate and healthful sea breezes. The town's name was changed to Southport in 1887 as business interests promoted plans to combine river transportation and railroad service making the town a major Southern port for the area. The plan, however, did not materialize, but the town of Southport grew and modernized as a result. To top off Dr. Fuller's wonderful

presentation, in attendance at the event were descendants of the families

that she spoke about. Their first-hand knowledge about the events

described were truly the icing on the cake!

If you missed Dr. Fuller's talk as part of the Speaker Series, be sure to attend the regular Kiwanis Membership Meeting on June 16, 2022, at 8:00 a.m. where she will be our guest speaker.



The evening was co-sponsored by Dosher Memorial Hospital and we want to thank Ms. Lynda Stanley, President and CEO of Dosher Memorial Hospital for her presentation and support for Kiwanis. She graduated from UNC Greensboro with a BS in Medical Technology and has a master's degree in Health Administration from Central Michigan University. Ms. Stanley is a familiar figure at the hospital and in Brunswick County and was herself a participant in Kiwanis programs growing up.

Additionally, Mr. Jeff Johnston spoke to the group about the various Kiwanis programs that he supports to include, Teen and Peer Court and Listening Post.

The last presentation for the 2022 Speaker Series will be held on November 1, 2022. The guest speaker will be Mr. Doug Zucker, a MBA graduate in wine from the prestigious Bordeaux School of Business, and owner of two award winning wine shops in the Leland and Porters Neck areas of North Carolina.






