



Kiwanis Plant Sale Celebrates 20 Years!



On April 9, 2022, the Southport-Oak Island Kiwanis Club hosted the 20th year of it's Kiwanis Plant Sales!

What started 20 years ago in Tom Pezanowski's driveway (and to his credit, he wasn't even a Kiwanian then), has progressed to our sale now

being held on the St. James Community Center parking lot. This main plant sale is now open to everyone up and down the route 211 corridor to include people from Oak Island who also come to look for the Encore azaleas that are so popular. In addition, this year we were back at the Southport Spring Festival after a two-year hiatus. So, a process that began on November 15, 2021, when we submitted our preliminary order to Flowerwood Nursery, culminated on Saturday, April 9, 2022, as we set up all of our shrubs, flowers, and herbs for sale on St. James parking lot.

In order to get to the day of the sale, there were many things that had to happen. First, in early March, Tom Pezanowski, Larry Trainor and John Ertlschweiger had to go to Tinga Nursery and Carolina Greenery to look at what was available and make selections. Larry is often asked, "How do you decide what to buy?" A lot of the decision process works off of what was bought and sold in the prior year, and yes, there are excel spreadsheets to keep track of that information! Sometimes we decide to go with a plant based on seeing something interesting at the nurseries and we give it a try. This year blueberry bushes were an experiment and all 5 were sold! But since the members who help out are not nursery experts, not everything is a success. This year, for example, we bought 3 shrubs of 3 different varieties of holly and went

On April 4, 2022, Howie Franklin, Director of the Cape Fear Jetport, was awarded the prestigious *Kiwanis Award for Excellence in Community Service* by the Awards and Recognition Committee Chair, Jack Addicks. Also attending was Greg McDonald, past Kiwanis President and Big Toy Day Lead, along with John Ertlschweiger, Kiwanis Secretary and Awards and Recognition Committee member. Several of Howie's support staff were also on hand for the ceremony.

Howie was recognized for his exceptional leadership, vision and selfless service as the Cape Fear Jetport "face to the community" for the cities of Southport and Oak Island.

A tireless advocate for non-profit organizations, like Kiwanis, Howie expressed his appreciation for all that the Kiwanis Club of Southport-Oak Island is doing for the kids in our communities.

During his 28 year tenure, Howie has developed the Cape Fear Jetport into one of North Carolina's top community jetports and a public service economic engine producing large volume fuel sales which generate significant tax revenue to the state.

Guest Speaker

Todd Coring, Chief of Police, from the Southport Police Department, shared the challenges of being a police force in a small community with an influx of visitors. Todd is a lifelong resident of Southport and a third-generation police chief. Currently, the force has 13 full time employees, 5 part time, and 2 civilian clerks. The department covers the 3.7 miles of downtown Southport. Last year, they responded to 12,000 calls with an average 6 to 8 minute response time.

Their community policing takes place with foot patrols downtown, a bike program, weekly calling program for shut-ins, a safe sanctuary where they meet quarterly with area churches, car seat safety checks, golf cart checks, and their annual Shop-with-a-Cop Program at Christmas.

It takes a lot of strategic planning and cooperation from surrounding departments to cover Southport's needs due to large influx of visitors. Currently the force is preparing for the 60,000 plus visitors expected during the 4th of July holiday.

Our club shared our appreciation for all they did to help with last week's Spring Festival.
